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# Critical Diversity Literacy (CDL)

An informed analytical orientation that enables a person to read prevailing social relations as one would a text, recognising the ways in which possibilities are being opened up or closed down for those differently positioned within the unfolding dynamics of specific social contexts.

## An understanding of the role of power in the construction of differences that make a difference

Recognition of the unequal symbolic and material value of different social locations. This includes acknowledging hegemonic positionalities and concomitant identities and how these position non-hegemonic others.

Analytical skills at unpacking how systems of of oppression intersect/interlock/co-constitute and co-construct each other; and how they are reproduced, resisted, and reframed.

A recognition of race, racism etc as current social problems, as well as, but not only, historical legacies.

Understanding social identities as the outcomes of social practices

The possession of a grammar and vocabulary that facilitates a discussion of privilege and oppression

The ability to translate ("see through") and interpret coded hegemonic practices.

An analysis of the ways in which diversity hierarchies and institutionalised oppressions are inflected through specific social contexts and material arrangements

Understanding the role of emotions, including our own emotional investments, in all of the above.

An engagement with transformation of these oppressive systems towards deepening social justice at all levels of social organization
